President's Corner

The Lake Is Full of Water!

I sincerely hope this newsletter finds each and every one of you in good health. We have seen a lot of high water here on Lake Gaston and we are not alone. In the last two months, parts of the Roanoke River basin upstream from us (which is the principal water source into LKG) have seen the number 1 and number 4 highest rainfall totals in the past 91 years! In the month of June alone, Kerr Reservoir (or Buggs Island Lake) had inflows that were 376% of the historical median for that month. All that water has to go somewhere and that somewhere is down hill.

The impacts are distributed all up and down the river. Cotton crops have been lost downstream, fields are too wet to plant, some homes can be damaged or made inaccessible. Campgrounds and boat ramps have been flooded up in Kerr Reservoir. Here on Lake Gaston we see higher water levels that sometimes cover docks and breach bulkheads. Wind and boat wakes exacerbate the problem. Many ask, "Who's fault is this and why is it happening to us?" Here is the Who and the Why.

As many of you know, the primary purpose for US Army Corps of Engineers building Kerr Dam was for flood control. Lake Gaston (LKG) also shares some of that role, but to a much lesser degree, as does Roanoke Rapids Lake (RR). Dominion's predecessor VEPCO built the LKG and RR dams primarily for power generation, with secondary purposes of flood control and recreation. Dominion owns the shoreline all around the lake.

Unlike many lakes, LKG water levels are strictly regulated through Dominion's license with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) and they must (and do) coordinate with the Corps. There are four operating states for Lake Gaston:

- Normal: 199–200 feet of elevation
- Fish Spawning: 199–201 feet of elevation
- Flood Control: up to 203 feet of elevation
- Drought: No lower than 197 feet (60.0 m) feet of elevation

Some years ago, Dominion, in response to LGA and community input, began a voluntary "Good Neighbor" Policy to limit Flood Control lake levels on LKG to 201.5 feet of elevation when at all possible. They have been remarkably good at sticking to that policy. Even at 201.5 feet, though, some docks and bulkheads are swamped.

So, who decides what state of operation we are in? Basically the Corps makes that call in their role in mitigating the flooding of the Roanoke River. As you would expect, during Flood Control, Kerr, LKG, and RR all release water at much higher rates than at normal times.

Managing the flood control of a major river like the Roanoke River, all 410 miles from the Appalachian mountains to the Albemarle Sound, is a demanding coordination of a very complex system. Sitting in the middle of these three lakes, Lake Gaston enjoys the "best" lake level control of them all.

Several years ago, the management plan for the Roanoke River (referred to as QRR) was updated. The result was a significant reduction in the number of days that the system was in Flood Control. That reduction means an equal number of extra days that LKG was in the normal range. It was a win for us.

In the end, Mother nature is driving the whole system. We have had a lot of rain this year. The Corps and Dominion are dealing with it as best they can.

Lastly, the LGA is continuing to track the recommendations of Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as well as State and local Departments of Health as they may apply to our activities. Our highest priority is the safety and wellbeing of our members and the community.

So far, we have postponed most of our activities and meetings until such time as the threat has subsided and are evaluating how we might conduct our activities as the situation evolves. Even when restrictions are relaxed, we will be mindful of balancing the benefit of our activity and the potential impact on our community and our volunteers (many of whom may fall into the At Risk category).

Enjoy the lake, be safe and be healthy.

Vegetation Exclosures Project

Covid work restrictions placed on NCSU and Wildlife Resource Commission folks have required LGA to modify our plans for revegetation in 2020. Typically a survey is conducted in the spring and fall of each year to determine the success of transplanting, organic spread of vegetation and the need for repairs to the exclosures, or "cages".

We conducted a fall survey in 2019 and had planned a spring survey in April. Work alone restrictions has delayed this survey and we now hope to conduct it in late July. Results will then allow us to develop a very limited work plan for 2020 with a focus on preventing any significant degradation of cages, "hold what you have". With limited resources and the concern for everyone's safety, we will not be asking folks to volunteer this year.

This collaborative effort with NCSU, the Commission as well as Virginia DGIF is how LGA members can directly develop and maintain a healthy lake ecosystem based on a diverse plant community dominated by native plant species.

If you have volunteered in the past, we thank you. We hope to resume our full efforts in 2021.

Weed Control Council Treatments

The Lake Gaston Weed Control Council (LGWCC) continues to fund herbicide treatments based upon recommendations from a Technical Advisory Group with support from the Lake Gaston Stakeholders Group. PLM Lake and Land Management was once again selected as the application contractor for these treatments in 2020.

Four treatments for Lyngbya have already been conducted (through July). Plans are for an additional treatment August 19th-21st, with anther the end of September.

The first treatment for Hydrilla was done on July 1st. This same area will be treated again Juy 29th and August 26th. Maps showing the specific treatment areas can be found at: http://www.lgwcc.org

E. coli testing

We distributed 90 plus Coliscan Easy gel water test kits to volunteers recently. This is a simple, accurate and quantitative way to identify and differentiate coliforms and E. coli (true fecal coliform). The presence of fecal coliform bacteria indicates contamination by human and/or animal fecal material.

If E. coli is present in water, disease-causing bacteria may also be present. With the exception of Miles Creek in the upper reaches of the Lake our tests have not detected significant amounts of E. coli.

Fall Vegetation Survey Plans

Plans for our fall volunteer vegetation survey are now underway. Jessica Bauman, Extension Associate for Lake Gaston with NC State University's Aquatic Plant Management Program is developing a training program that can be accessed and viewed on the web.

While we all like to get "hands on" with the plants, we think this will be a great start for new volunteers and serve as a refresher for those continuing from past seasons. We will bring more information to you on this in August. We hope you can take time this fall to help with this important project.

NCSU Aquatic Management update

Our partners at NCSU continue to conduct bio based sonar to detect and record submersed vegetation development. They are continuing their water quality sampling and are now also conducting E. coli tests at eighteen tributary locations. They are developing a water quality presentation for stakeholders to help educate us on this important topic.

Our partners

Along with NC State, the NC Wildlife Resource Commission and the Lake Gaston Weed Control Council we are fortunate to work with Dominion Power, Virginia Wildlife Resources, and NC DEQ to help monitor and improve the Lake Gaston environment. We feel very fortunate to have these partners and appreciate all their hard work.

This is the time of the year that we start seeing the hurricane and hazardous storms pick up in occurrence. In order to ensure that members have timely, location specific hazardous weather information, please make use of the emergency information from the counties around the lake by signing up for notifications:

The information available from the county emergency services offices is local to the county and areas of the affected county. It is also potentially the timeliest source of information tied to a specific address. As a for instance, the counties all receive up to date, accurate weather information from the National Weather Service and the state governments. Dominion Power has the counties' emergency services offices in its notification tree. The Lake Gaston Association will still provide high water warnings and other critical information, but our communication is not as timely as that available through these official emergency services sources.

As we near the end of the most popular season for being at the lake, please start planning for the cold months and coordinate with neighbors so that they can look out for you and you can look out for them. The Fall is when we all need to get into the Watch Out for Our Neighborhood role, and the time to make sure we keep our neighbors in mind when extreme weather strikes. Have cell phone numbers as backups for hardline phones. Check on your neighbors and let them know that you are safe.

We are trying to schedule a Community Shred late August. We will advertise when scheduling is complete, and we have set up a complete plan for doing this safely with COVID-19 in mind.

Now is the time to schedule needed maintenance on heating systems and ventilation, change the air filters, check the batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, and get the chimney cleaned. Buy the salt for the walkway and stairs and put it where it is handy to get to.

News from the Government Relations Committee

The dust has settled and the County budgets have been approved for FY2020-2021. The local county fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30.

The information below is our annual posting for each county of the total budget, the ad valorem tax rate, and funding to the Lake Gaston Weed Control Council (LGWCC) for noxious weed control.

County	Total Budget (1)	Tax Rate per \$100 (2)	LGWCC Funding (3)
Halifax, NC	\$ 46,956,893	\$0.76	\$ 58K
Northampton, NC	\$ 34,138,435	\$0.91	\$116K
Warren, NC	\$ 33,522,088	\$0.81	\$116K
Brunswick, VA	\$ 43,513,345	\$0.53	\$ 90K
Mecklenburg, VA	\$128,650,365	\$0.42	\$116K

- (1) Note that Virginia counties are funded differently than North Carolina counties, which results in higher budget totals, but lower ad valorem tax rates.
- (2) NC: Halifax went down 1 cent, Northampton went down 1 cent, Warren went up 2 cents VA: Brunswick and Mecklenburg stayed the same as last year.
- (3) All five counties continued with the same LGWCC funding as FY2019-2020

US Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 93 - 2020 training dates

August 22, Sept 26, Oct 17

America's Boating Safety Course is an eight hour course covering the basics of boating and is appropriate for youth as well as the adult boater. Successful completion of this course satisfies the education requirement for youth to operate a PWC in both Virginia and North Carolina.

Remember: <u>Virginia now has a law</u> that all boaters in the waters of Virginia will have proof of taking a Boating Course. All Motor Boat Operators operating a vessel with a 10 HP engine or greater, must meet these requirements. All PWC Operators regardless of age must have proof of taking a Boating Course.

North Carolina Law effective January 1, 2014 requires that all PWC and Motor Boat Operators who were born after 1 Jan 1988 will have proof of taking a Boating Course, if they are operating a vessel with a 10 HP engine or greater.

Clarification: Boaters on Lake Gaston need to be in compliance with their state of residence for Boater Education Certification. This is true whether the boater is a resident of North Carolina, Virginia, or any other state as recognized by both states' enforcement officers.

The fee for the course is \$30.00, **Preregistration and prepayment are required.** Courses are now taught at the Long Bridge VFD, 1678 Eaton Ferry Rd., Littleton, NC 27850. All classes are on Saturday from 8:30am to 5:00pm, with the exam given at the end of class.

Please bring your lunch. Bottled water and sodas can be purchased for 50 cents. It is a busy day - but rewarding. Remember – **Preregistration and Prepayment are required.**

Hazard buoys ...

Hazard buoys provide warnings, information, mark underwater hazards and provide a system for navigation. They are there for your safety.

For most boat and PWC operators, these markers help to successfully navigate the waters at Lake Gaston. For a few out there, they are targets either due to drinking and driving, inattentive at the wheel or even worse, it's fun to target.

Each has been tethered to the lake floor for a purpose. Each also cost money and requires time and effort to replace. Please be on the look out for these markers. If you see a damaged or missing hazard buoy:

- County of Brunswick waters (Pea Hill Creek and Poplar Creek) call 434-848-3107.
- County of Mecklenburg waters call 434-738-6191.
- North Carolina waters contact NC Wildlife at 919-707-0150.

Buoys placed in Lake Gaston need state & federal approval

Dominion Energy as well as the Virginia Department of Game & Inland Fisheries and North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission have received complaints concerning buoys being placed in the lake to deter boats near boat docks. Both Virginia Department of Game & Inland Fisheries and North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission, as well as Dominion, do not allow buoys to be placed in the lake without state and federal approval. Any buoys placed in the lake will be considered an obstruction to navigation and will be required to be removed.

Adam Fields message about considerate boating

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT!!! Please please! EVERYONE with boats, especially Wakesurf boats, people tubing, fishing boats, pontooning, jet skiing, and folks sightseeing on boats 21' and up..

Be aware of the waves that you're making and know that people are concerned for their shorelines and docks, their boats, and the safety of their children while swimming and doing water sports.

When at all possible, **WAKESURF** way out away from everyone, ideally in the main lake somewhere vs in the tight spaces like creeks. People hate the waves you are making. You will also feel way safer this weekend to be out there further away from other boats instead of the higher trafficked tight spaces, even if it IS a little bit rougher out in the main lake. You'll be in deeper water which helps your surf wave and you'll be less likely to get ran over out there between falls.

Tubers! You boat patterns are erratic and confusing to other boaters, plus your riders typically like waves. If you're driving a wild boat pattern to whip the rider, or are looking for waves to launch off of, Get out of the tight spaces where people want it calmer!!! You ruin it for the skiers and wakeboarders who want it calm. Please Share the lake well so everyone isn't as jammed into the creeks.

Obviously waterskiing and advanced wakeboarding require calmer water for safety and enjoyment. As a multi-time world champion and coach of champions, we literally CANNOT do what we are trying to do if the water is rough. Plus, that's how you get hurt... When you tell us to go away and ride out in the middle of the lake that really isn't a doable option, like 95% of the time. We need it calm. So, we encourage all of you wakeboarders and skiers to get up early and get out there and again use the main lake and open space early before the wind and boat traffic pick up. That's a great time to ride and the main lake is the best when it's good because you don't have to turn the boat so much, like you have to in the creeks. And then too, the residents can enjoy their peace in the mornings before it gets packed in their creeks.

Sightseers! It's way better to see the beautiful homes when you drop the speed down to 10-14 mph on your deck boats and bow riders, but that's the speed that makes the biggest waves! While you're driving by admiring someone's home you are often swamping their dock and shoreline as you pass by. Look out for that to not accidentally appear very disrespectful.

Fisherman. You scare people when you rip through a tight space. Please be aware of that fear factor and know that that is why people fuss about your boats. Keep it chill and be extra careful this weekend and beyond. You'd hate to whip around a corner and a fallen child wakeboarder be in the water right in front of you, knowing you can't steer those boats well at high speeds. That'll be a scary if not deadly occurance. I've personally seen two people get ran over by boats. It was horrific both times.

Fishermen, you are the foolish looking ones when you slam into a big sightseers wave or a wakeboarders wave at high speed and smack your boat. Look ahead and mind your speed when approaching a MASSIVE wave. It's better for your boat anyways to take that wave a certain way.

Fisherman! If you do post up in the middle of the creek, and someone drives around you, between you and the shore.. um, well, that's about their only option. Essentially, don't block a space then be mad when someone drives around you! Plus, the way wave building works, if a boat drives around you, the kink in the wave they built will be biggest heading right towards you. Please share the space.

With that said, surfers, don't be in there in the first place, and wakeboarders once you go by once or twice and realize a fisherman is there, keep moving on to a new spot so you aren't making repetitive passes by the dude who is trying to fish. Please share the space!

Pontooners! Careful not to put all your biggest passengers in the front and then be riding too bow heavy. It's makes for quite a mess when you're front-weighted and you smack into a wakesurfing wave. And (in my opinion) that's not the big wake maker's fault in that scenario if you see a massive wave and drive right into it with all your weight in the front and then nearly sink..

Kayakers and Paddleboarders. If you're worried about safety on your boards, go early, go late, and for sure stick close to the shorelines. Go where other boats can't. Don't be out in the middle and then be mad when a boat drives by you.

Jet skiers! Oh Geez! You are the scariest of all. You scare other boaters, skiers, surfers, boarders, moms, dads, etc.. Please stay further away from other boats and people in tight spaces. Please keep your speed down in tight spaces. It's too easy to zip up on someone or something in the water and create a super dangerous situation. It only takes an


instant. In addition, the wakeboarders and skiers and surfers prefer great water. You zipping around near us not only scares us but also ruins the water conditions for us to do what we are out there to do. Please share the space and keep our safety and enjoyment in mind!


Many of these scenarios could happen in the main lake OR in a creek or other tighter space. So, regardless where you are, try to drive observantly and conscientiously. With the water higher than normal, many homeowners are more on edge about the waves than they normally are. Let's all try to work together so everyone has a good time, feels safe, and does get to enjoy whatever thing they like to do on the water.






RULES FOR PASSING AND OVERTAKING OTHER VESSELS
